## Covered Bridge Book

Polio eradication has been the Rotary's top priority since 1985 with more than \$1.2 billion contributed to the effort. Through this effort, we have achieved a 99% decline in the number of polio cases. There are still four countries where the polio virus is endemic, namely Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan. In 2008, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation challenged Rotary International to match a \$100 million grant with \$100 million of Rotary funds over three years. Each club is challenged to raise \$2000 each year over three years. The Rotary Club of Oxford has accepted this challenge and has instituted several fundraisers to achieve this goal. The main fundraiser will be the proceeds from the sale of the Covered Bridge book
